

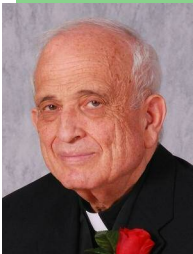

Focused on Christ's Coming

We've often hear of Advent as a season of waiting, a season where the Church calls us to keep watch. Keeping watch during a cold winter night, I imagine would be difficult. Frosted windows blur our vision. The thought of needing to de-frost the car in the morning distracts us. What do I see? What can I see? The temptation to turn away from the window is alluring, and the watchman easily loses focus.

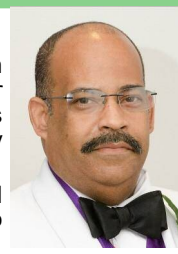

As the leaves fall, the weather gets colder and the nights longer, let us stop for a moment to think of our brothers and sisters who have been touched by hurricanes and earthquakes, and ask God to bless them and keep them in His Holy hands.

In September our Supreme Chaplain Archbishop Lori wrote an article entitled, "Peripheral Vision, We are called to look beyond our own immediate concerns and to reach out to those most in need."

What is peripheral vision? What we see out the corner of our eyes. We see much out of the corners of our eyes, but do we notice what we see? Do we really notice that person that needs us or do we overlook them. Do we go out of our way to talk with that brother knight that sits by himself in the club house or the one we think is strange at the grove?

"Something similar can also happen in the depth of our hearts. The peripheral vision of our heart diminishes. Culture of Life Corner

Life Chains Across Maryland On October 1, Charles County Right to Life sponsored Life Chains at two locations: the annual one on Rt. 6 in La Plata, and a new one on Rt. 231 in Benedict. In La Plata, 52 people (including Fathers Larry Swink and Sam Plummer from Sacred Heart Parish) participated; signs stretched from the County Courthouse to Rt. 301. In Benedict, there were 12 attendees, including Father Kevin Cusick of St. Francis de Sales Parish. Additional Life Chains in Maryland were held in Cambridge, Emmitsburg, Frederick, Gaithersburg, Hancock, Jarrettsville, Lexington Park – see photo above, Taneytown, Thurmont, and Westminster.

40 Days for Life in College Park Tom Trunk, coordinator for 40 Days for Life in College Park, scheduled a living rosary for October 1, in front of the Metropolitan Family Planning abortion clinic. Bill McMahon and members of Patuxent Council 2203 brought a 100-foot long rosary, with two dozen or so people participating in the prayers. Bill will be glad to make the rosary available to other groups who wish to have a public recitation.

Abortionists Allowed to Continue Remember James Scott Pendergraft IV, whose license to practice medicine in Maryland expired in 1999 and was never renewed, but still performed third-trimester abortions at an undisclosed, unlicensed clinic in Forestville? The Maryland Board of Physicians closed the clinic, operated in the name of another abortionist, in December 2013. Pendergraft has had his medical license suspended – but never revoked – five times in Florida (where he still operates four abortion clinics), agreed not to practice medicine in North Carolina for violating state laws, and was arrested in South Carolina, where he does not have a medical license, for conducting in-home abortions out-of-the-trunk of his car. He was convicted of possessing and dispensing drugs illegally, fined, given five years of probation, and prohibited from ever obtaining a medical license in South Carolina. Amazingly, he was not punished for performing illegal abortions. Archbishop Lori Blessed Mary's Home Maryland On October 11, 2017, Baltimore Archbishop William E. Lori blessed Mary's Home Maryland, the new Catholic maternity home in Howard County. This pro-life ministry provides a safe home environment for at-risk expectant mothers, and their children throughout their pregnancy and afterward. Each mother receives counseling, as well as parenting and daily living skills, and is provided pre-natal, infant health and health care for all of their children. With structure and guidance, mothers aim to achieve independent living, with a healthy and sustainable future. WASHINGTON, D.C. – A local assembly of the Knights of Columbus (KofC) has donated more than \$10,000 to the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS), to support the formation of future Catholic U.S. Military chaplains. Archbishop Michael J. Curley Assembly #383 of College Park, MD, raised the money in a year-long "pass the helmet" campaign at local parishes. On Saturday, assembly leaders James D. Williams, Jr., and Arthur H. Blenkle presented the check for \$10,083.49 to His Excellency, the Most Reverend Timothy P. Broglio, JCD, AMS, at the Edwin Cardinal O'Brien Pastoral Center in Washington.

The money will go to the Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program (CSP), a vocations partnership between the AMS, the KofC, and cooperating dioceses and religious communities around the country. Under the CSP, the home diocese or religious community of each co-sponsored seminarian shares with the AMS the cost of the seminarian's six-to-seven year formation, each paying 50% of tuition, room and board and other expenses. Once the priest is ordained, he serves for at least three years in his home diocese or religious community before his bishop or religious superior releases him for full-time military service. When the priest leaves the military, he returns to the diocese or community for further pastoral work. So both the AMS and the partner diocese or community benefit from his vocation.

40 Days for Life Fall Campaign

The fall campaign for 40 Days for Life began on Wednesday, September 27, and ran through Sunday, November 5. This is the largest campaign ever, held in 375 cities around the world. Since the program was started in 2007, some 750,000 volunteers have prayed and fasted near abortion clinics to save 13,305 babies.

This fall, campaigns were conducted at five locations in Maryland. Several members of the parishes in this council participated in a rosary event in College Park.
