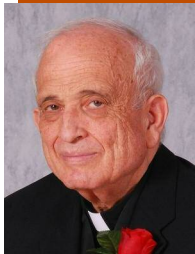

Rejoice and Exalt!

Documents written by the Pope are traditionally named according to the first few words and Pope Francis' third apostolic exhortation, released this past April, is no exception. *Gaudete et Exultate* (Latin for Rejoice and Exalt) is a timely title for us who continue to celebrate our Lord's Resurrection in this Easter Season. While apostolic exhortations summarize the fruits of synods, as *Amoris Laetitia* did with the Synods on Family in 2014 and 2015, the Pope can also use them to encourage God's people – us – to a deeper spiritual and Christian life. *Gaudete et exultate* does exactly that: Pope Francis reminds us that "Jesus wants our happiness and wants us to be saints. He does not want us to settle for a bland and mediocre existence."

All are called to holiness, but how are we to grow in holiness? Among the many ways, the Pope highlights that often we grow by the smaller gestures each day. Take for example, the Vietnamese Cardinal, Francis-Xavier van Thuan. While imprisoned by the communist government, he chose "to live the present moment, filling it to the brim with love... [accomplishing] ordinary actions in an extraordinary way." So where do we start? By seeking to act with a greater intentionality for a love of God wherever we find ourselves throughout our day.

Pope Francis' personal, relatable and easy-to-follow style, combined with the practical guidance offered concerning our own response to sainthood makes *Gaudete et exultate* a definite read for this summer!

40 Days for Life The Spring 2018 campaign for 40 Days for Life is over, and it produced continued positive results. In the summer of 2004, four young people gathered in a small room to pray for guidance on how they should oppose a Planned Parenthood clinic that was operating in the university-town of College Station, Texas. The answer was fast and pray for 40 days outside of the clinic. And so, the now semi-annual prayer-filled events was begun. In these 14 years, 5,605 total campaigns have been conducted in 769 cities in 50 countries, with some 750,000 individuals participating. But success is more than activities. The movement has saved 14,643 children from abortion, closed 96 abortion facilities and convinced 177 abortion workers to quit the industry. God is truly at work. Will you help in the fall campaign?

Witnessing in Bethesda Praying outside of LeRoy Carhart's abortion facility in the Medical Building at the Wildwood Shopping Center in Bethesda is a year-round effort, regardless of the weather. A group assembles every Monday from 9:00 to 11:00 AM. There also is a group gathering for prayer on Tuesday evenings at 6:30 PM, and on Wednesday mornings at 9:00 AM. Results of Maryland Legislative Session There were six bills dealing with pro-life issues that came before the Maryland General Assembly in the last session which ended on April 9. Only one was passed by both the Senate and House and signed into law by the Governor. That was the Child Conceived Without Consent-Termination of Parental Rights Act (also referred to as Rape Survivor Family Protection Act). The law removes paternity rights from any father whose child was conceived due to his act of rape. The other five bills did not get through the legislative process. They are 1) Pregnant Inmates-Medical Care Act, which would have allowed abortion for prisoners; 2) Abortions-Viability Act, which would have defined viability to begin at 24-weeks of gestation; 3) Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act, which would have prohibited abortions 24 weeks after fertilizations; 4) Unborn Child Protection From Dismemberment Abortion Act of 2018, which would have prohibited dismemberment abortions; and 5) Abortions Sought by Minors - Parental Consent Act. Update Your Beneficiaries

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things. Take, for example, the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it may very well be that the person you originally selected as the beneficiary is no longer the person you would want to receive the policy proceeds. If you

bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since married, your policies should be updated to reflect your spouse as beneficiary. Maybe you've had children since, who are not named on the policies.

Most people list a primary beneficiary, who is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary, an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

I routinely call all of my policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy – that is, the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the status two nine nine eight six five six of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.

I look forward to meeting with each of you to discuss your family's needs

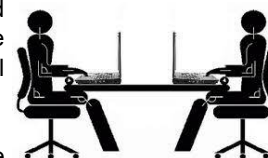
