

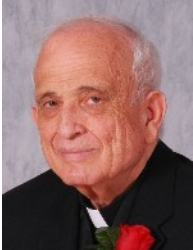

### Believe in the Gospel

In the first chapter of the Gospel of Mark, following the arrest of St. John the Baptist, Jesus enters Galilee to proclaim the gospel. His words, "Repent and believe in the Gospel" may sound familiar to us as these words are an option for the priest to use on Ash

Wednesday while marking our foreheads with ashes.

Frequently and correctly, Lent is associated with the first part: repentance. Our fasting and penances throughout Lent, indeed, help us to reorder our time and activities correctly to make time for God. We often adopt practices of fasting and almsgiving or giving up food or TV. While these practices are good and holy, we cannot forget about the second part: believe in the Gospel. For the Gospel can easily be taken for granted. After all, isn't the Gospel what we've been hearing year in and year out?

This Lent we have the opportunity to enter into the Passion, death, and resurrection of Christ. It's a story that we have heard, perhaps, many times and have grown accustomed to. Lent is a time to wake up and renew our faith – to reread the story. The apostles cried out to the Lord, "Increase our faith!" and that prayer can be made our own. It is a prayer ideal for reading the scriptures. It is a prayer that renews our faith and helps us rediscover the riches of Christ through His gospels!

Asking for Christ's grace and accompaniment throughout this season of Lent, may find ourselves on Easter morning strengthened and renewed with deeper faith in the Gospel and in Christ!

This December 08, 2018, a gathering of pro-life workers, Knights and supporters, met for a reception at Holy Redeemer Parish after the Feast of the Immaculate Conception Holy Day Mass at 5pm. All parishioners were invited and had a good time with our Pro-Life advocates.

Two to three babies are rescued weekly at the abortion clinic on Greenbelt Road, the Metropolitan Family Planning Clinic. Hugh O'Donnell is in charge of the Scriptural Rosary for Life at the clinic. Please support our Scriptural Rosary for Life as announced.

Katherine Hunter is in charge of Sidewalk Advocate for Life, Tom Trunk is the 40 Days for Life advocate for our region, and I am the chairman of Culture of Life (Pro-Life) Activities within our Council.

At a June 2004 meeting of the Synod of Bishops, officials at the Vatican intervened on the US debate concerning pro-choice Roman Catholic politicians being refused communion. Cardinal Francis Arinze was quoted as saying, "If they should not receive, then they should not be given." Bishop Wilton D. Gregory, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, later issued a statement affirming Arinze's view. He also stated "Each diocesan bishop has the right and duty to address such issues of serious pastoral concern as he judges best in his local church, in accord with pastoral and canonical norms." ## SUPREME COUNCIL INFORMATION

Recent nominees to the federal judiciary have endured pointed questions about their faith during confirmation hearings and in written questionnaires. One Catholic nominee was told, "The dogma lives loudly in you, and that's of concern." Others have been interrogated about their membership in the Knights of Columbus, with the implication that participation in the largest Catholic fraternal organization in the country - one that has accomplished so much good for over a century - could be disqualifying. To call out the Knights of Columbus for derision is simply appalling. Religious tests are unconstitutional and unjust, and they are an attack on all people of faith. Religion inspires people to serve their neighbors by living out their faith in their local communities. Yet religious tests tell not only Catholics, but all Americans, that they cannot both serve their country and live out their faith. These attitudes may have prevailed at points in America's history, but they should not find new life in this country's future. Our country is highly pluralistic and, currently, highly polarized. Imposing religious tests on judicial nominees deepens the divides in this country and fosters resentment. A religious test says, "You do not belong here. You are not a true American." Senators should be working to navigate our country through these tumultuous times, not actively working to intensify the waves. It is time for these discriminatory, anti-Catholic questions to stop. 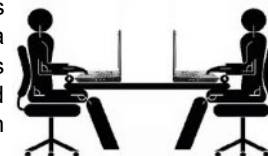
