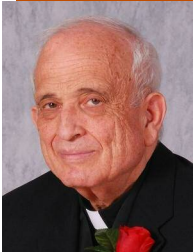

Several months ago, Birthright moved from Silver Spring to Olney to better serve clients in upper Montgomery County. KofC Ultrasound Program

On June 21, the Knights of Columbus donated a state-of-the-art 3D/4D ultrasound machine to the Columbia Pregnancy Center (CPC) in Howard County. St. Michael's of Poplar Springs Council 10525 raised half of the \$36,700 cost, while the Supreme Council matched the funds. About 20 people representing the local council, state council, and the care center were present for the presentation. This was the 21st ultrasound machine the Knights have donated to pregnancy care centers in Maryland. The program needs funds to meet requests from several additional pregnancy care centers. Several councils and districts are planning to hold or have held fundraisers specifically for the Ultrasound Program. Can your council do the same? Update Your Beneficiaries

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things. Take, for example, the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it may very well be that the person you originally selected as the beneficiary is no longer the person you would want to receive the policy proceeds. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since married, your policies should be updated to reflect your spouse as beneficiary. Maybe you've had children since, who are not named on the policies.

Most people list a primary beneficiary, who is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary, an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

I routinely call all of my policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy – that is, the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.

I look forward to meeting with each of you to discuss your family's needs

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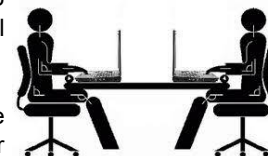
