

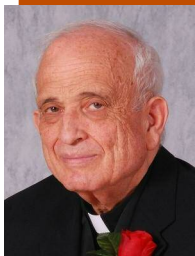

### Running the Race: Saintry Support

On October 14<sup>th</sup>, 2018, Pope Francis canonized 7 new saints. Although the 7 saints came from various walks of life, all of them now, having 'ran the race' with Christ, have triumphed with Him: they have kept the Faith. Now in Christ's Kingdom, they reign with Him eternally!

Often the word 'Church' refers only to the visible Church. But there is more than what meets the eye. To help reveal the deeper reality of the Church, the Catechism of the Catholic Church defines 3 states of the Church: The Church Triumphant, the Church Penitent, and the Church Militant.

The Church Triumphant is the state of the Church in Heaven of whose members, the saints, have 'finished the race' and now enjoy eternal life with God. The Church Penitent is the state of the Church whose members are 'finishing the race' being purified in purgatory so as to become saints in the Church Triumphant! The Church Militant is the most familiar to us for it is the state of the Church of whose members are 'running the race' of faith: those who are journeying towards Heaven. That's you and I!

Runners in a race have fans cheering: supporting and encouraging the runners. In our 'race' we have 'fans,' the saints. A great gift of a canonization is to rejoice that fellow Catholics have 'ran the race' and now are saints. Another gift is knowing that we, the Church Militant, have gained 7 new fans who cheer us on, interceding for us, so that where they now are, we will, God-willing, one day be.

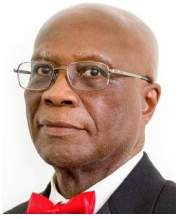

In my previous contribution to this publication, I stated that The Knights of Columbus Faith in Action program model is designed around Faith, Family, Community and Life. Each of these four categories include opportunities for youth involvement. The vision for this program model is for our brother Knights to serve in an inclusive way, to strengthen the bonds between faith and family, to grow deeper in parish life and to be a beacon for our community. Youth are an essential part of our mission.

To serve the youth of our community, we must move beyond the Columbian Square Circle and instead offer your council's leadership and skills to existing parish-based youth group. If a parish-based youth group does not exist, consider working with your pastor to start a new group sponsored by the parish and supported by the Knights of Columbus.

- Working with your pastor, obtain permission and recommendations on working with a youth group in concert with parish life.
- Check with your pastor about safe environment training such as VIRTUS training, it's vital that all adults, Knights or otherwise, be aware of best practices when working with youth.
- Knights are welcome to serve as volunteer in support of the parish youth group under guidance of the parish and other Knights.

Some of programs that can be adapted for youth moving through parish life can include

**Food for Families** – Kids can help gather canned goods for your Food for Families program.

**Special Olympics** – Children in the youth group can volunteer for Special Olympics event(s) in your area.

**Habitat for Humanity** – Volunteering for Habitat for Humanity is both an opportunity to help your community directly and also a chance for youth to learn practical skills for home ownership.

**Rosary Program** – October is dedicated to Our Lady, Queen of the Holy Rosary. This program provides an opportunity for youth to serve directly as leaders in the parish.

Brothers, remember leadership is not about positions but about actions.

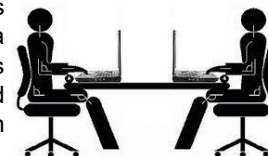
