

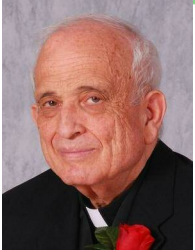

The Gospel of John recounts the calling of the first disciples with detail, "It was about 4 o'clock in the afternoon" (John 1:39). 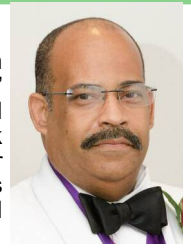

Grand Knight's Message



Worthy Brothers Knights and Columbian Family:
The summer months are behind us. It will soon be time for our inside actives. Congratulations' to the softball teams for a great season and your sportsmanship. This fraternal year I ask you not to think only of softball, shuffleboard or dart leagues. These actives are a part of us and have made our brotherhood stronger and great.

However, this year I ask you to remember when you first became a Knight, to remember the first principle of our order CHARITY. This year the Knight of Columbus will celebrate 135 years of charitable works, and our council 79 years of the same. PG 2809 is over 900 members strong, some are here locally and some have moved away. This year Supreme convention theme was "Convinced of God's Love and Power".

Did you know that "Convinced of God's Love and Power", the Knights of Columbus worldwide donated more than \$177 million dollars and over 75 million hours of volunteer service. That comes out to \$24 an hour for every hour volunteered. Supreme has averaged that out to 39 hours for every man in the order.

My brothers of 2809, how do we fare in this average? This year I ask all my brothers for 1 hour of volunteer service to a council activity. I know we are all busy with work, family and parish life; but ask yourself and remember why you joined the Knights, if not to help others.

"No other Catholic organization offers men what we do." We help a man to bolster his faith and strengthen his family, we offer him the opportunity to live out his faith through CHARITY.

Once again, I ask my brothers of 2809 for 1 hour of volunteer work. If you can't help us physically help us financially with a donation for Coats for Kids, or the .1K for Special Olympics. The Coats for Kids program started in 2009 and since that time the Knights have given 395,000 new coats and last year over 1,700 councils participated in this program. This will be the first year we at 2809 will try this program. If this program isn't to your liking we have many more like the .1K for Special Olympics, Bread for our brothers and the blood drive, start a team or make a donation.

In founding the Knights of Columbus Fr. McGivney sought to respond to the difficulties affecting Catholics families, and to strengthen or faith and parishes. Times have changed, but our mission has not.

"This year let us be in even greater ways who we are called to be as brother Knights. Let us strive to be that radiant and attractive witness of fraternal communion that our church and our world so desperately needs. Let us strive to be authentic witnesses of how to care for one another and how to encourage and accompany one another. We can and we will do these things as the spiritual son of Fr. McGivney, WE CAN AND WILL DO THIS BECAUSE WE ARE CONVINCED OF GOD'S LOVE AND POWER." [1]

40 Days for Life Fall Campaign The fall campaign for 40 Days for Life will be held from Wednesday, September 27 through Sunday, November 5. Since the program was started in 2007, some 750,000 volunteers have prayed and fasted near abortion clinics to save 13,305 babies. This fall, campaigns will be conducted at six locations in Maryland:

The College Park campaign will begin with a Kickoff Rally at 10 AM on Saturday, September 23, at St. Hugh Church, Grenoble Hall, in Greenbelt. Ernie Ohlhoff, Maryland Right to Life, and Katherine Hunter, Sidewalk Advocates for Life, are guest speakers. On Sunday, October 1, at 3 PM, the campaign will conduct a Living Rosary at 5915 Greenbelt Road, College Park. Can your council provide assistance praying outside an abortion center, either for an entire day or at a set hour for a week or even the entire 40 days? Ultrasound Program Since the Ultrasound Program began in 2009, the Knights of Columbus has placed over 829 machines in pregnancy care centers or in mobile medical units, located in all 50 states. In Maryland, 20 units have been donated, one more has been approved, and another is in the approval process. Supreme Council has set a goal to place 1,000 machines by 2019, which is estimated to help save one million lives.

One Admissions Degree per District per Month.

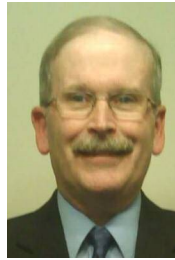
The Key to Growing Our Order is Recruitment.

The convocation, inspired by the apostolic exhortation of Pope Francis titled *Evangelii Gaudium* (The Joy of the Gospel), was a historic opportunity initiated by our bishops to respond to the pope's call for "a new chapter of evangelization" in our country.

At the Knights of Columbus, we are committed to going beyond our own comfort zone and beyond our own nation to reach those peripheries. For example, we help AIDS orphans in Uganda, homeless and displaced civilians in Ukraine, persecuted Christians in Egypt, survivors of genocide in Iraq, child refugees from North Korea, typhoon survivors in the Philippines, flood victims in Mexico and people with physical disabilities in Vietnam, Cuba and Haiti.

As Catholics, we profess a universal Church. As missionary disciples, we must make our universal Church increasingly present at the peripheries as the process of globalization accelerates. And as Knights of Columbus, we answer this call.

Quoting Blessed Paul VI, Pope Francis observed that today "people prefer to listen to witnesses: they 'thirst for authenticity' and 'call for evangelizers to speak of a God whom they themselves know'" (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 150).

This means that the most difficult challenge many of us face may not be in reaching out to peripheries around the world; the most difficult challenge may be in reaching out to our own neighbor.
