

Chaplain's Message



LOVING US GENTLY

We desire to carry out the will of God in our daily lives. We seek to challenge ourselves to ascertain what God's will is. As an example, Jesus carried out the will of his Father in total self-sacrifice, in total love, with unquestioning faith and in perfect harmony with the Father. Easy for Jesus because Jesus and the Father are one. How do we learn what God expects of us?

- In the Old Testament (Samuel 1: Chapter 3) Samuel discovers that God teaches us in unexpected ways. God is patient and uses the appropriate technique that would work for us. Samuel was unprepared to be taught by God in the form of a dream. It was his mentor, Eli who interpreted the dreams to teach Samuel how to respond and learn from his special calling. By learning what God desires of him, Samuel becomes a prophet and leader of the Israelites.
- St. Peter showed what he had learned by answering the question of Jesus, "But who do you say I am." He responds, "The Christ of God." (Luke 9:20). With that answer Jesus knew that His Father had taught Peter and that Peter was on his way to becoming a special disciple.
- As for us, we have the teachings of Jesus forwarded to us from the Apostles and Gospel writers as well as those of the Old Testament. The grace received in the Sacraments also prepares us in each of their various purposes to carry the will of God and seek a purpose for our lives. We may be like Samuel or St. Peter and called to great accomplishments or we may be as Eli, a great teacher and bearer of great wisdom. However, it is mostly through our life experiences, both ordinary and extraordinary, that the Holy Spirit Jesus left us will help us discern a purpose. And if we are in error with discernment, the Holy Spirit will correct us on the journey. Not seeing the forest because of the trees can often be an impediment to discovering this purpose of God. For example, the labors of a good wife found in Proverbs 31, 10-31 relate how the daily and seemingly mundane activities of a woman can contribute to the learning and understanding of God's work. It may be that a purpose will not be revealed to us at the time we expect.
- We pray for discernment and finding a purpose in all we do. This is our hope and faith. May God continue with the arduous tasks of teaching us and may each of us be aware of His abundant blessings.
